The Krech's are Kings of the World!

Tim and Bre Krech, along with Anne Scheuerman, are your 2007 C-Scow World Champions. The Krech's sailing in their first regatta as a married couple sailed a great event winning two of the five races.



This was 13th C-Worlds at Delavan Lake YC in what is quickly becoming the highlight event of the fall season. This year brought the largest fleet to Delavan yet - 33 teams! Racing was extremely competitive in this tight fleet. Every boat in the top ten, except for the Krech's, had at least one race where they were consumed by the fleet.

Race 1 was a battle between Tim Krech M-20 and Art Larson I-28. The fleet raced on the north end of the lake sailing a south breeze around 8 to 15mph - course W2+. Krech and Larson pulled away for their own battle with Krech getting the first bullet. Third was the Wagon team of Augie Barkow V-11 (defending World Champions).

Race 2 was sailed after lunch as the course moved to the south end

of the lake. This led to tight quarters for this big fleet. The course was a WM2. The first rounding was extremely crowded, followed by big changes in position on that first downwind. Barkow was leading downwind as the breeze came up but had to retire as his traveler car blew out. With V-11 off the course a three boat battle set up between Jeff Solum M-3, Chris Andert M-25 and Frank Davenport B-303. Positions swapped a few times upwind before Solum took control downwind, and short windward back to the finish line followed by Davenport and Andert.

Race 3 was the same course set-up as race 2. Many teams made a dash to the DLYC to pick up thirds. Positions changed often as a pack of ten boats battled hard throughout the race. Jamie Kimball I-42 won a close finish with multiple boats shooting the line behind him. Solum M-3 was second, Krech third, Patrick Lynch BL-3 fourth, and Anne Porter Muller B-217 fifth. At the conclusion of Day 1 Krech M-20 led with 9 points, 2nd was Kimball I-42 with 15 points, 3rd was Andert M-25 with 16 points, 4th was Jason Ostbye M-17 with 24 points, and fifth was J.P. Mull D-29 with 28 points.

Saturday night the DLYC held their World Famous Fish Boil. Attendance was huge as many of the club members turned out to join the C-fleet. The Hold 'em Tournament faced some competition this year as four-table Flip Cup tournament set up just feet away from the card tables. Needless to say it was a loud night at the DLYC!

Race 4 on Sunday morning brought more of the same warm south breeze. The fleet raced a long WM3. Andert and Krech led a tight bunch of boats to the top mark. Heading downwind the fleet shuffled and condensed even more. Just like yesterday afternoon a group of ten boats battled again up front. Barkow back from his breakdown pushed Krech up the lake, but couldn't get around him in the end. Krech was first followed by Barkow, P. Lynch BL-3, Michael Lynch I-14, and Porter-Muller.

Race 5 was a sprint - a W1+. The course was moved back to the north end, and everyone scrambled to make things happen quickly. Mull D-29 led the fleet to the top mark followed closely by Krech. The first few boats gybed at the offset while Barkow led a pack down the right side which paid off huge. Barkow won the race followed by Ostbye M-17, Davenport B-303, Wicks M-3, and Matt Prange E-111.
