C-Scow Nationals - Race One

Sixty C-Scows showed up at LGYC for the C-National Championship despite the efforts on mother nature. Sailors that drove in Thursday had to dodge thunderstorms, tornados and flooded interstate highways. All cleared by Friday morning, and no one seemed too worse for wear. The breeze built higher than the forecasted 10 to 15 mph out of the south. Most sailors brought 3rd crews out with them for Race 1, or picked them up on the water.

Race 1 was a W3+ at 225 degrees. The fleet got off to a clean start. Boats worked shifts on both sides of the course. Ed Eckert A-136 led at the top followed closely by Jamie Kimball I-17 and Steve Avery P-51. A pack of at least 15 boats battled for the next three laps. Positions in the group moved some, but no one made any big gains. Jamie and Rob Kimball took the race on the last upwind leg. The top 20 from Race 1

C-Scow Nationals - Race Two

Race 2 was sailed after a break for lunch. The breeze as boats left the docks was around 15mph. The race committee postponed for a few minutes as the wind shifted to the right and they waited for it to lock in. The course was set at a W3+ again at 245 degrees. Boats stacked starboard end of the line. There were a handfull of boats called over at the gun, but most of the fleet got off cleanly.

Kent Haeger B-12 and Chris Andert M-25 led the middle right pack, and Peter Keck OO-88 and Chris Craig LF-1 led the group off the left side. Keck rounded in first followed by Craig and Haeger. The lead pack this race was about ten boats. They were able to stretch it out from the rest of the fleet. Keck and Haeger battled for the lead for most of the race, but it was John McNeil SL-11 that made the big move on the last leg.
