### C-Scow Nationals - Race Three

Sixty C-Scows sailed out this morning under clear skies and forecasted big breeze. Most teams left the dock with three onboard even though it wasn't quite white capping yet. By the time the fleet reached the bottom of the lake for their 9:30am warning gun the wind built to 15mph.

The course was set to a W3+ out of the SW. The fleet started after one postponement and one general recall. The majority of the fleet went left and worked the south shore. Tim and Bre Krech M-20 led fleet to the top mark followed closely by Eric Oppen V-400 and Chris Craig LF-1.

The next few legs a pack of six boats (M-20, LF-1, M-25, V-400, B-12 and V-11) led the rest of the fleet around the course. The breeze strengthened throughout the race building to 18-20 mph by the final down and up. At the last leeward mark rounding LF-1 rounded the left gate and headed towards Williams Bay with B-12, V-11 and V-400. M-20, M-25 and OO-88 rounded the right gate and headed towards the south shore. The right side paid off big. Chris Craig LF-1 sailed to victory followed closely by Augie Barkow V-11 and Kent Haeger B-12. Top twenty for Race 3:
